Anchorage (291,826)	<p>15.20.050 - Junk vehicles prohibited. A. It is unlawful for the registered owner or other person with legal right to possession of a junk vehicle to place or allow such vehicle to remain in public view on any property within the municipality for more than five days. It is also unlawful for the owner, tenant or other person in possession or control of any property to cause or allow a junk vehicle to be placed or remain in public view on such property for more than five days. B. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection A of this section, if the director has reasonable grounds to believe that repairs can be made to render a junk vehicle operable, that the registered owner or other person entitled to possession of the vehicle is willing to undertake or have performed such repairs, that the vehicle does not pose any health or safety hazard, and that there is no reasonable means for removing the vehicle from public view while repairs are being performed, the director may authorize a period of no more than 30 days for the performance of such repairs. In no case, however, may this section be construed as authorizing the operation of a junkyard or other salvage or repair business where other requirements of the law have not been met. C. If a junk vehicle has been abandoned on private property, the owner, tenant or other person in control or possession of the property upon which the vehicle has been abandoned may request the vehicle's removal pursuant to section 15.20.040.E.</p>
Juneau (31,275)	<p>36.30.020 - Definitions. Abandoned vehicle means a vehicle registered or titled, as required under state law, that reasonably appears to have been left unattended, standing, parked upon or within ten feet of the traveled portion of a highway or vehicular way or area in excess of 48 hours, or a vehicle registered or titled, as required under state law, that reasonably appears to have been left standing or parked on private property in excess of 24 hours or upon other public property for more than 48 hours, without the consent of the owner or person in charge of the property. [...]Junked vehicle means a vehicle that: (A) Is not currently registered under AS 28.10, except for a vehicle not currently registered under AS 28.10 and used exclusively for competitive racing; (B) Is stripped, wrecked, or otherwise inoperable due to mechanical failure; (C) Has not been repaired because of mechanical difficulties or because the cost of repairs required to make it operable exceeds the fair market value of the vehicle; or (D) Is in a condition that exhibits more than one of the following elements: (1) Broken glass; (2) Missing wheels or tires; (3) Missing body panels or parts; or (4) Missing drive train parts. [...] 36.30.230 - Abandoned and junked vehicles. (a) No person may deposit or maintain a junked or abandoned vehicle on any private property or on any street, sidewalk, recreation area, open space, or other public property. It shall be a defense to a charge under this section that the vehicle was located within a permanent structure or on property lawfully used as a junkyard pursuant to title 49 of this Code.</p>
